RESOLUTION 22-06

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE OF HEBRON TO EXECUTE A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE LICKING COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, The Village of Hebron desires to construct and purchase materials for the installation of a crosswalk, including ADA ramps, crosswalk signage, striping, and other necessary supplies in an effort to improve safety for pedestrians and bicyclists, and

WHEREAS, The Licking County Health Department is a recipient of grant funds from the Ohio Department of Health by and through Creating Healthy Communities, for the purpose of promoting physical activity, and

WHEREAS, Said grant funds may be given by the Licking County Health Department to the Village of Hebron to supplement the Village in its endeavor to construct a crosswalk and promote physical activity.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF HEBRON, STATE OF OHIO, WITH A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS ELECTED THERETO CONCURRING THAT:

Section I: The Village of Hebron by and through Mayor James Layton is authorized to execute a Memorandum of Understanding with The Licking County Health Department that authorizes the use of grant money to supplement the construction and purchase of materials for a crosswalk in the Village of Hebron.

Memorandum of Understanding

The Village of Hebron
and
The Licking County Health Department

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) sets forth the terms and understanding between the Licking County Health Department (LCHD) and the Village of Hebron.

WHEREAS, LCHD is the recipient of grant funds from the Ohio Department of Health through the Creating Healthy Communities (CHC) grant to improve physical activity and access to healthy food options.

WHEREAS, award made through this agreement is contingent upon the availability of funds from the Ohio Department of Health and for this purpose the grant funds are to be used to meet the objective set forth by the 2022 Ohio Department of Health CHC grant; and

WHEREAS, LCHD is the fiscal agent for these grants.


NOW, THEREFORE, the parties have agreed as follows:

1. Scope of Service
 - a. This agreement will remain in effect until December 31, 2022.
 - b. LCHD shall provide the following services and comply with the following covenants:
 - i. Through the CHC grant, LCHD agrees to provide a maximum of \$6,800.00 in compensation to the Village of Hebron for the construction and purchase of materials for installing a crosswalk in the Village of Hebron, including ADA ramps, crosswalk signage, striping, and any other necessary supplies in an effort to improve safety for pedestrians and bicyclists.
 - ii. Provide technical assistance with planning and purchasing.
 - iii. Assist with education and promotion to the community.
 - iv. Measure outcomes.
 - c. In consideration of the foregoing, the Village of Hebron hereby agrees to:
 - i. Installation of the pedestrian crosswalk at Burch St. by December 31, 2022, as part of the active living objective for the 2022 CHC grant. If circumstances prevent the Village of Hebron from meeting this deadline, notification must be made to LCHD, and this contract may be amended.
 - ii. An invoice from the Village of Hebron must be received by November 1, 2022.
 - iii. Obtain all required permits, equipment, and any supplies necessary to complete the project.
 - iv. Notify LCHD of installation date and provide updates on progress.
 - v. Assist with outcome measures of the final project.

2. Agreement Period
LCHD agrees to provide monetary support for the Village of Hebron to purchase supplies and install a crosswalk at Burch St. in the Village of Hebron and fulfill the active living objective in the 2022 CHC grant from the date this document is signed through December 31, 2022.
3. Termination and Amendment
The terms of this agreement are pursuant to the availability of grant funding through the Ohio Department of Health. If the amount of grant funding made available to LCHD is reduced, and the terms of this agreement cannot be met due to this reason, LCHD reserves the right to reduce the monetary support provided to the Village of Hebron. A thirty-day written notice will be provided by either party to terminate this agreement.
